Coon- no data yet, just added survey question to CNF. Skaflestad- switching text is expensive for most small departments. Coon- Having a unified curriculum would make accreditation easier. Davis- Usage of text may not be the best decision making tool for determining which text we correlate to. We need to make a final decision on if the council will be adopting a single curriculum so that we can be more efficient with our time and our committee's time. Descutner – Exhibit 13b has correlated text listed with it. We dropped about 600 questions from the 2008 FFI bank because it didn't have references to all texts. It would help the admin side out if we did pick a single text when we adopt a standard.</p>

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<p>NFPA 1006: Technical Rescuer- Brian Crisp</p> <p>A. After Sitka's meeting more members were solicited for committee. Looked through various programs from several states. 1670 is being used as a reference for the check-offs, in addition to 1006. Need to see about adopting both standards to be able to get IFSAC and ProBoard certification on this level. 1670 recommended adoption with no changes. 1006 still would require chap 5 before any other level of certification is available in this standard. Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ) definition outlined in committee report.</p> <p>B. Both 1006 and 1670 recommended for adoption as is.</p>	
<p>NFPA 1021: Fire Officer- Robert Dennard</p> <p>A. No progress made toward FO II.</p>	
<p>NFPA 1033: Certified Fire Investigator – Al Stevens (excused)</p> <p>A. Brian Belega- Investigation committee in town soliciting funding for reaching out to rural FD to bring them into town for training. 1033 will be up for revision and their group is waiting to see the final result so they can help vet it.</p> <p>Descutner- NFPA will be adding a few prerequisite knowledge changes under 1.3, but no other major modifications are expected.</p>	
<p>NFPA 1035: Fire Life Safety Educator/JFIS- Mahlon Greene (excused)</p> <p>A. Descutner- we spent time getting the bank ready and the level of certification available and it has been very underutilized. Material is now outdated again, but no action planned to revitalize it until demand is there from the constituency.</p>

NFPA 1006: Standard for Technical Rescuer <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Committee would like to see NFPA 1006 adopted with the AHJ's designated as outlined in the committee report. **Motion for Adoption moved by Crisp to adopt 1006 as submitted by committee, seconded by Arlen. Passed in unanimous. Gibbs asked to have future agendas only reference the text name of standards. Since NFPA 1670- <i>Standard on Operations and Training for Technical Search and Rescue Incidents, 2009 Edition</i> provides the training operations references for the Technical rescuer recommend adoption of this standard too. Will post for 30 day public comment before final adoption. 		Setup meeting for public notice on NFPA 1670 after 30 day notice and comment period. Format future agendas to address certification standard title instead of NFPA number.
B. NFPA 1403: Standard for Live Fire Training Evolutions <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Steeves- Got some answers to previous questions. This standard is not for vehicle fires and live burns. Liability under current standard is greater due to the current standard being less stringent than the national standard. Recommends adopting the national standard as written with no amendments. **Motion for Adoption Steeves moves to adopt 1403 as written and Coon seconds. Davis- Will the national standard be prohibitive to small 		NFPA 1403

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<p>departments? Steeves- departments are not required to meet these requirements. Descutner- Could be a factor in accreditation audit approval. Simulation is an option if core objective is met. Skaflestad- Concerned that the rural communities will not be able to do the compartment requirements. Crisp- Used it recently and everything went well. Steeves- CVFR had a similar experience using it. Coon- Could Hoonah have done a burn with the old AK standard? Skaflestad- Has done classes with the old AK standard using a connex, but the connex would not be usable again. Davis- Why are we looking at adopting this standard if we don't do live fire during tests? Descutner- If part of our role under the statute is training curriculum then it would be appropriate. The AFSC has received call from Training Officers with safety concerns in using the old AK standard; recommended use of the more stringent NFPA 1403 standard. Lane- If someone calls, we need to have a safe recommendation for live burns. Crisp- in Kenai, they paid the money to do the asbestos testing and when it came back positive it was the owner's responsibility to do the abatement. Gibbs- Suggests it is outside our scope to adopt because it is not specific to a professional qualification level. Would stand behind forming a recommendation stance.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Davis moves to amend the original motion to provide the direction to the admin staff to recommend use of this 1403 standard for live burn situations.
